Project

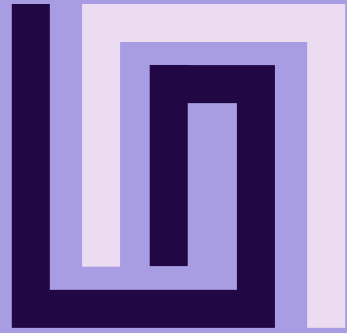
In today's youth work field, many young people spend far more time indoors than outside, disconnected from the natural world and its benefits for personal growth and wellbeing. Youth workers often lack the knowledge and non-formal tools to bring outdoor education into their everyday practice.

Our project aims to strengthen the capacity of youth workers to use outdoor education as an innovative method for supporting the personal and behavioural development of young people, while promoting environmental responsibility.

Objectives:

- 1. Participants will acquire theoretical knowledge on the principles of outdoor education, its impact on youth development, and its role in promoting sustainability.*
- 2. Participants will develop practical skills for preparing and facilitating outdoor activities — including planning, risk management, decision-making, and problem-solving — and will learn and test at least 5 innovative non-formal methods applicable to work with young people.*
- 3. Participants will gain increased confidence, motivation, and commitment to use outdoor education as a tool for developing young people's skills and promoting ecological values.*

About our mobility



The working language of the Training Course is English. Don't be afraid if your English is not perfect! Neither is ours. But it should be good enough to participate actively!

Since you will be in Romania, here are some Romanian basics:

Salut = hello / Bună dimineața = good morning / Bună ziua = good afternoon / Bună seara = good evening / Noapte bună = good night / Pa! or La revedere = goodbye / Ce faci? Bine. = How are you? I'm doing fine. / Te rog = please / Mulțumesc = thank you.

We think you already know what a training course is, but just to make sure we have a common understanding, here is the definition:

A Training Course is a project that brings together groups of young people from two or more countries, allowing them to discuss various themes, whilst learning about each other's countries and cultures. It is based on a transnational partnership between two or more organizations from different countries.

A Training Course is not: a festival, holiday, travel, or camp.

We will use a lot of non-formal methods in order to learn in a fun way, but we will be quite strict about respecting the program and being on time for all sessions. You can consult the activities program now and we also have sessions when we will discuss it. Since our training focuses on outdoor education, we will have many activities in outdoor spaces, as well as some indoor sessions.



Participants

25 YOUTH WORKERS 5 COUNTRIES

We will be a group of 28 people from Romania, Italy, Spain, Türkiye, and Poland (25 participants and 3 trainers/facilitators), all youth workers interested in bringing outdoor education into their work with young people.

People who want to improve their competencies and capacity to plan, facilitate, and evaluate outdoor activities, and who want to learn how to use non-formal, ecological methods to support young people's development and connection with nature.

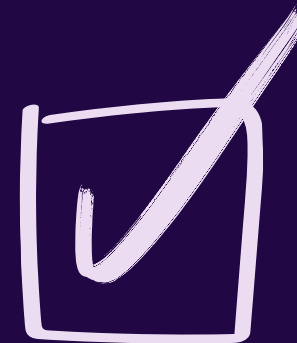
Within the project, you will gain the knowledge, skills, and confidence to use outdoor education as a tool for young people's personal development and for promoting environmental responsibility in your community.

You will have the opportunity to meet other youth workers who share the same challenges and aspirations. You will also have the opportunity to share your experience and learn about new outdoor education approaches and non-formal methods, which you can use in your further work with young people in your community.

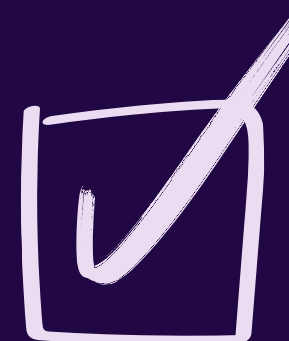


Shortly, participants' involvement can be described as follows:

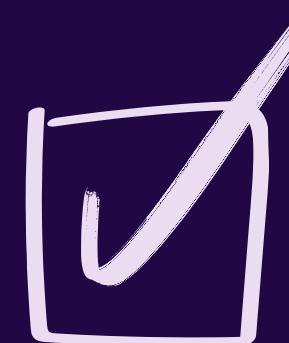
A STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE



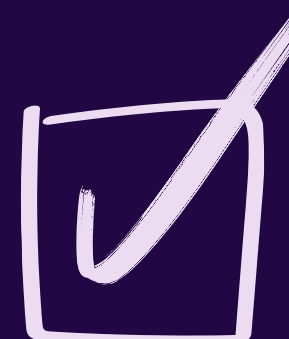
During the training, it is expected that you will be active, contributing to the learning process and having critical inputs as well as constant feedback related to the program and the activities.



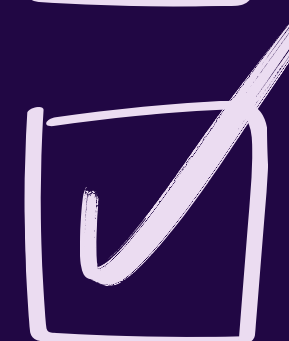
If you wish, you can facilitate energizers for the group or share your own experiences with outdoor activities during evening intercultural activities.



In the follow-up part, you will implement what you've learned in your local youth work, organize activities using new methods, and act as multipliers in your communities; in this process, you will be supported by mentoring from trainers.



You will be ready to promote the training through social media during the days of our meeting and share results with your local youth work networks.



You will respect all the safety measures (both indoors and outdoors) communicated to you by the organizers and by the accommodation facility.

Accommodation, meals, and workshops will take place in the same space, C.C.S.S. Tei.

The rooms are for two people, and each room has its own bathroom. The rooms are equipped with a refrigerator and a TV.

The location is set inside a sports complex, right on the shore of a lake — perfect for some of our outdoor sessions and activities.

The location is equipped with Wi-Fi, but does not offer additional services (ironing, laundry, room service, etc.).



A few aspects

- **Bucharest** is a friendly and safe city. However, it's a very big city, and that means it's good to be careful (don't leave luggage unattended, don't exchange currency in unsafe places).
- During **rush hours**, the traffic is very heavy; use the metro if you want to reach various places in the city.
- You can **pay** with the card in all decent places. If you want to use **cash**, we recommend that you change it at the bank. Also, there are many ATMs where you can withdraw cash. In Romania, it is still not possible to pay in cash with euros. The local currency is “leu”/RON (1 euro = 5 RON).
- October can be a fickle month, especially in recent years. It can be very hot, but it can also be cold (especially at night). It can also rain. An **umbrella** or a **raincoat** could be useful.
- We will have an **intercultural evening**, during which each team will present/offer something specific to its country to the others. It can be anything, from cultural stories to small traditional snacks. Please prepare for this moment.

- The easiest option **from Otopeni Airport to the accommodation** is Uber/Bolt (75-150 lei/trip, 15-25 euros).
- A slightly cheaper option is: the train from the airport to Gara de Nord, then Uber/Bolt.
- The cheapest option (but quite confusing) is public transport.
- Ask the organizer for more information.

The detailed schedule is still being finalised and will be shared closer to the mobility — but here's a preview of what each day will focus on:

Day 1 — Introduction

Team building in nature, getting to know each other and our organisations, setting the scene for the training

Day 2 — Theoretical Concepts

What is outdoor education, its main types (experiential, adventure, environmental), and risk assessment for outdoor activities

Day 3 — Applicability in Youth Work

Connecting non-formal education with outdoor teaching, designing and planning outdoor sessions, exploring non-formal methods

Day 4 — Benefits for Youth Development

How outdoor education supports young people's growth, the 5Cs of Positive Youth Development, and identifying local community needs

Day 5 — Outdoor Education & Ecological Behaviour

Reconnecting with nature, discussions on environmental awareness, building sustainable eco-habits

Day 6 — Community Practice

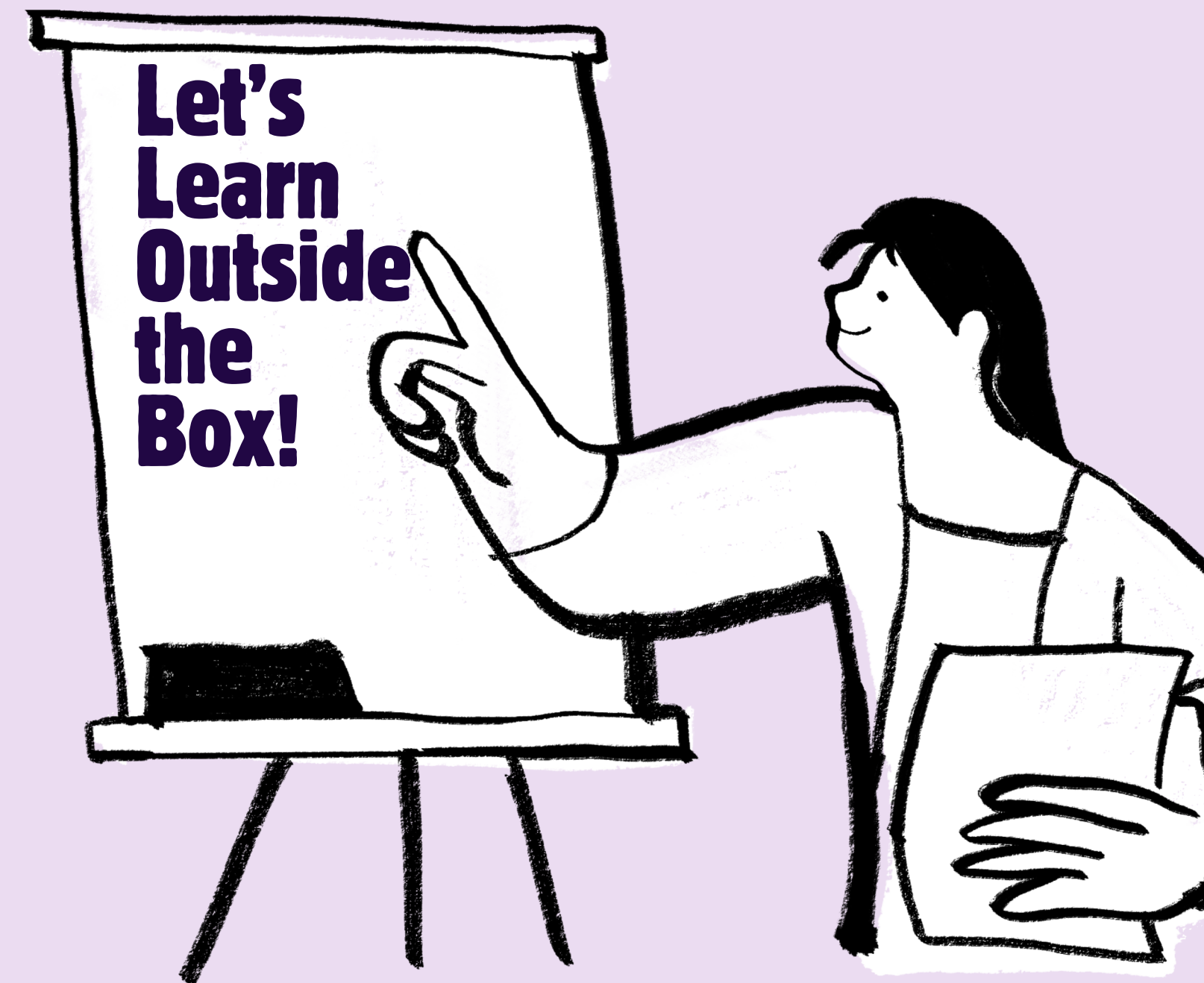
Putting learning into action together with local young people from Liceul George Coşbuc, through an outdoor treasure hunt and hands-on facilitation

Action planning, dissemination planning, Erasmus+ opportunities for future partnerships, and final evaluation

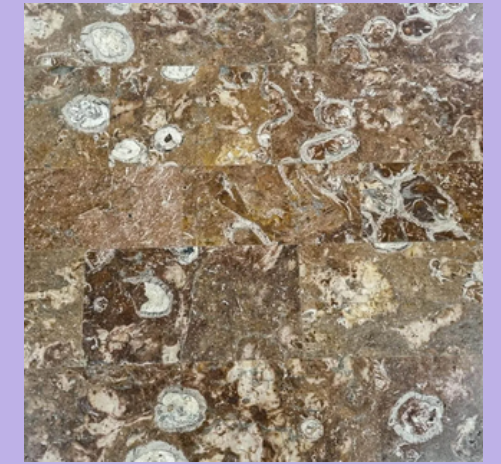
